I am glad of this opportunity for an update - we are following the Church's guidance in its advice: "remember that there's no expectation that churches will reopen at the same time or in the same way. Good and careful preparation, not haste, is key."

Darlingscott and also Stretton, not yet open.

Our next services in Church are as follows:

Holy Communion service at Whitchurch at 9.30am on Sunday 6th September.

Holy Communion at Tredington at 10.30am, also on 6th September.

Holy Communion at Ilmington, 13th September at 9.30am.

Holy Communion at Preston on Stour 9.30am 27th September Harvest theme.

Harvest service 10.30am at Tredington on the 4th October. (

As you will see we are beginning to hold more services across the Benefices, but will also continue to have the 10.30am 'Church at Home' YouTube service each Sunday. There are plans in hand for more services in October assuming that all goes well with coming out of lockdown measures. The current situation remains that hymns and socialising are not possible and face coverings are mandatory, as well as the now familiar social distancing, but despite all this people are thankful to be feeling 'at home and safe' in church. We could put it in terms of 'Picking up the Pieces'. It is September now and the incidence of the Covid virus in the UK is beginning to stabilise. Our school children are due to return to school to pick up with their education. It has been such a difficult summer and a number of young people hoping to go to university have had their hopes dashed through no fault of their own. We pray for all our young people; they are so resilient, so determined, so full of life that it will be their energy and vision that allows everyone to pick up the pieces from these months of devastation.

The future cannot be known and we may even wonder whether there will be a second spike of the virus. Whatever happens we can each make our contribution towards a safer time by the way that we interact with others. I have mentioned coming back to church in such a way that we feel 'at home and safe' to be there. The Eucharist is being celebrated and the word means 'thanksgiving'. As we receive communion we can express our thankfulness for the renewed fellowship, even as we learn ways of being safely together. Yes, it is still a sadness not to sing or to shake hands as we meet, but we trust in the small steps being taken towards a new normality. Picking up the Pieces is not easy, but Christian faith always inspires us towards a new hope and we continue to support one another across our village communities in thankfulness.

Nature Notes September 2020

There are many hedgerow delights this month, although not all can be foraged for our use as some are poisonous to us but loved by the birds and other animals. We can expect (and hope) to see blackberries, rosehips, purple black sloes, rowan berries, hawthorn berries to name a few. So take care if you go foraging and remember to leave some for the birds and other creatures that need them for food. God provides lovingly for all His creation which includes us. He meets all our needs and the Autumn time is a reminder to us of that. Gill

Hedgerow Crumble cake (serves 8)

For the sponge

280g/10oz self-raising flour

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp salt

1 tsp ground ginger

2 tsp ground cinnamon

2 dessert apples

Juice and finely grated zest of ½ unwaxed lemon

250g/9oz golden caster sugar

200g/7oz unsalted butter, melted and cooled, plus more for the tin

3 eggs, lightly beaten

1 tsp vanilla extract

100ml/31/2fl oz whole milk

250g/9oz blackberries

For the crumble

100g/3 ½oz unsalted butter, chilled, cut into pieces 150g/5½oz plain flour, sifted 80g/2¾oz light muscovado sugar ½ tsp ground cinnamon handful (about 50g/2oz) of roughly

chopped cobnuts or hazelnuts

Preheat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/350F/gas mark 4.

Butter a 23cm round springform tin and line the base with baking parchment. Make the crumble topping first: in a large bowl, rub the butter, flour, sugar and cinnamon together into fine crumbs with your fingertips (if this is over-mixed in a food mixer, it quickly turns to biscuit dough). For the cake, sift the flour, baking powder, salt, ginger and cinnamon into a large bowl. Peel, core and dice the apples finely and separately toss them in the lemon juice and zest. Set aside. In another large bowl, using a hand-held electric whisk, or in a food mixer, beat the sugar, cooled melted butter, eggs and vanilla until thick and creamy; this will take a few minutes on high speed. With a large spoon, fold in the flour mixture, alternating with the milk. Don't over-mix. Spoon the batter into the prepared tin, then scatter the apples and blackberries over the surface and gently push them in. Sprinkle over the crumble, top with the nuts and bake in the preheated oven for 50–60 minutes, or until a skewer comes out clean.

Cool the cake in the tin for about 10 minutes, then remove from the tin and serve 'From Seasonal Baking' by Fiona Cairns, published by Weidenfeld & Nicolson,

Overlooked Plants: 5 by Paul Williams

Incarvillea delavayi – named for Pierre D 'Incarville, a French Jesuit missionary in China and Jean Marie Delavay, a French Catholic missionary also in China, – there was no escape for the Chinese!

I like plants that look exotic but are in fact pretty tough and well able to survive a South Warwickshire winter. Three or four spring to mind but let us just look at one, Incarvillea, this month. I am writing this on the first of June and this Chinese plant has already been in flower a week or so, maybe encouraged to flower that bit earlier by the hot weather in May. It first sprouts a ruff of tough looking, crinkly leaves. From this rises a straight thick stem which bears at its top a succession of eight or nine, disproportionally large, bright pink, flared trumpet flowers through June to August. Nip off faded flowers to keep it looking tidy if you can be fussed. The leaves lengthen to attractive, robust, fern-like, slightly glossy 'fronds'. Its common name, Hardy Gloxinia, gives you some hint of its exotic appearance. Plant the crowns in autumn in a spot that gets full sun. Don't plant it where it will sit in over- wet soil during the winter.

<u>Ilmington Parish Council August Report</u>

PLAYING FIELDS: The Playing Fields were recently re-opened for exercise purposes and the first cricket match has been held. The children's playground re-opened 31st July. Users are urged to follow Government guidance and signs providing advice have been posted. It is not practicable to clean the toilets as necessary to reduce the risk of Covid. Accordingly, the Council maintains its advice not to enter or use these facilities.

PLAYGROUND SLIDE: Spoil at the rear of the Tennis Courts has been removed and the mounding around the slide extended. Some parishioners queried this action. The slide is now approaching the end of its life and the standards in place at its installation have been superseded. In particular, guard rails do not comply with current standards and an inspection has noted corrosion of these rails. The initial mounding was probably installed to reduce the risks of falls from height and the extension of the mound reduces the need for guard rails. Furthermore, in planning for its replacement, the Council is aware of the modern approach, which positions the slide atop a suitable mound. In short, this work has secured the ongoing safe use of the slide and prepares the site for its replacement. The slopes were sown with wildflowers but the dry period voided germination.




